Partnership Poster Project for October 2000

Once again the North Carolina Archaeological Society is preparing a special poster to celebrate October 2000 as Archaeology Month. This time, however, the NCAS is being joined by the North Carolina Pottery Center (also a non-profit organization) in sponsoring the poster. It will be titled "CERAMICS THROUGH THE CENTURIES" and features examples of prehistoric and historic pottery made in North Carolina. This poster will serve to introduce the history of pottery to many new North Carolinians and highlight major developments of this craft from Native American potters to the Arts Movement of the 1920s. Illustrations may include prehistoric pots from various regions of the state, historic Cherokee and Catawba vessels, early lead-glazed earthenwares of the Moravian and non-Moravian traditions, salt-glazed stonewares, alkaline-glazed stonewares, and finally, the "tourist" wares of the rejuvenated craft.


