



our present Course of Proceeding in America as conceived it is impossible to bring the War to a happy Issue, or to gain the Indians over to our Interest, unless we break the Communication of the French Settlements, which may be done by Building a strong Fort at the Mouth of the River Condo; a second on the South Side of the Lake Huron; and a third at the River de St. Francis; but it will be proper to begin with building a Fort at the River Condo & to have several Boats ready to command the Navigation of the Lake Erie, which has a communication with the Lake Huron & by means of those Boats we may build the Fort on the South Side of the Lake Huron, & also supply the Garrisons with all manner of Provisions in Summer. The aforesaid Forts & Row Gallies built on the Lake Erie & Huron may command the whole of the Indian Trade, & render the French Settlements of little or no Service to them.


PLAN of the RIVER of







5<sup>th</sup>, Common spring Tide rises 16 feet, and equinoctial Springs 26 feet.




A VIEW of the CITY of MONTREAL in CANADA taken from the Top of the MOUNTAIN.




# PLAN and SECTIONS of the NEW WORKS proposed at S<sup>t</sup>. JOHNS



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


VIEW of DE CHAMBAUT on the RIVER St LAURENCE above QUEBEC . August 1765. 31
