Spring 2013 Meeting

Joe Herbert, NCAC Chair, called the meeting to order at 8:30 and welcomed members present. Executive Committee members present: Brett Riggs (Vice-Chair), Susan Bamann (Exec. 1. Old Business: None

2. New Business: Michael O'Neal was presented as the nominee for Secretary/Treasurer. There was a motion to vote on the nominee, which was seconded. By voice vote, Mr. O'Neal was elected to the position of Secretary/Treasurer. Joe Herbert thanked Shawn Patch for his tenure in the position.
