INTRODUCTION

This bibliography is the first attempt to draw together the anthropological literature pertinent to the original inhabitants of North Carolina. The concept of such a bibliography began with the compilation of some archaeological references by Dr. B. C. Keel for the Division of Archives and History, North Carolina Department of Cultural Resources. Additional entries were provided by the staff of that Division's Archaeology Section, and that version of the bibliography was presented to the recently organized North Carolina Archaeological Council. Members of the Council further augmented the list of references, and expanded the scope to include information from all branches of anthropological study.

The current edition is not exhaustive, but has been published to satisfy an immediate need for this material. It is anticipated that new editions will be issued at approximately two-year intervals, with the second edition containing all previous publications not listed herein.

This is a gross bibliography in the sense that no attempt has been made to evaluate the quality of each publication listed. If the subject matter was pertinent to the theme, the publication was included. Some entries have value only as curiosities, while others are immediately germane to current archaeological and anthropological research in North Carolina.

Included in this edition are publications on the prehistoric archaeology, physical anthropology, ethnography, ethnology, history and ethnohistory of the various American Indian cultures of North Carolina. No attempt has been made to separate the references into the above subdivisions, but this is planned for the second edition.
